At Landsdale Farm we have various programs both farmer-led and self-guided to ensure the students get the most out of their day here with us!

Every group attending a Landsdale Farm excursion will receive:

- A reserved undercover area with tables and chairs for the day
- Farmer led activities
- A cart ride around the farm. A fun and relaxing way for students to see the farm
- Free time to explore the farm and gardens with access to some self-guided activities
- Access to 2 play-ground areas and a water fountain
- Complimentary free return visit pass for each student

The following are programs we currently offer for Primary Schools.





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Farmer Led

Animal Feeding (All Years - Must arrive before 9.30am - max 25 students)

Do you know what a biscuit of hay is or what the difference is between hay or straw? Students can assist the farmers in giving the animals their morning feed.

All About Chickens (Year K-6)

Get up close and personal with our chickens on the farm while learning some fun facts. Feeding and collecting eggs included.

Worm Farm Discovery (Year K-6)

Get hands on learning in this worm farm activity. Students will discover our fun and interesting worm farm system and have the chance to feed, water and dig for worms!

Learn all about how our worms convert organic waste into nutrient rich fertiliser and help us live more sustainably.

Barnyard Fun (Year K-6)

Students get up close and personal with the animals and the barn. Animals include rabbits, guinea pigs, lambs, chickens and ponies. Animals may vary depending on the day.

Animal Grooming (Year 3-6)

Farm animals need a brush and a bath too! Join our farmer to learn how we look after the animals and find out why a care routine is important to an animal's well-being. Animals and grooming techniques will vary.

Teacher Led

Create a Sheep Wool sheep (Year PP- 2)

Some sheep such as the Merino are known for producing lots of high-quality wool. Learn about different breeds and their uses. Do you know how farmers care for sheep? Create your own sheep from real sheep's wool.

Find Me at the Farm (Year K-6)

Students split up into small groups to search around the farm for each animal on the worksheet provided. Can you find them all?





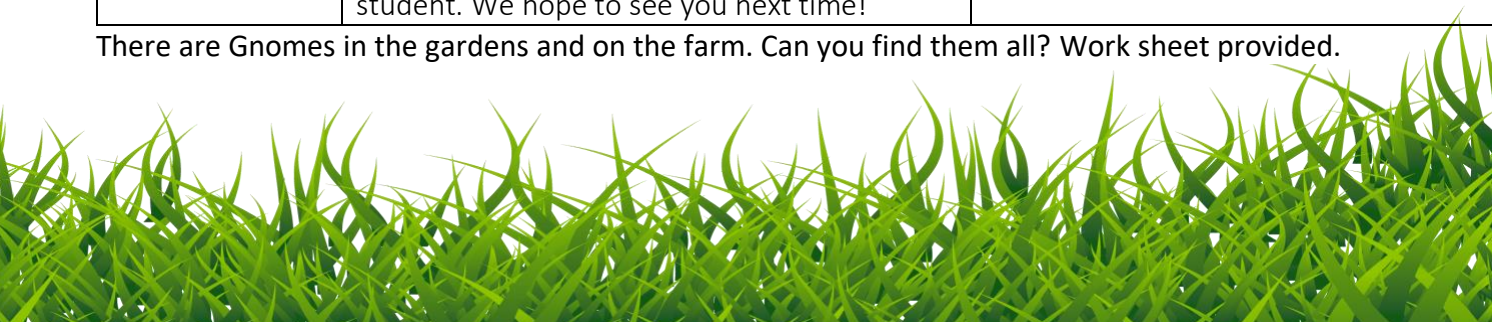
